## Agreed Removal Decision

**Registrant:** Aimee Louise Agombar

**PIN:** 10I4236E

**Part(s) of the register:** Registered Nurse – Children Nursing

**Relevant Location:** Essex

On 28 May 2021, we received a referral raising a concern about Aimee Louise Agombar's fitness to practise. It's alleged that Aimee Louise Agombar acted outside the scope of her competence in that she prescribed and administered medication when she was not permitted to do so.

It is further alleged that Aimee Louise Agombar breached her Interim Conditions of Practice Order imposed by the NMC by administering medication without being properly supervised or deemed competent by her employer.

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee. No allegation against Aimee Louise Agombar has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees. Aimee Louise Agombar accepts the concerns that have been raised about her.

On 18 March 2024, we received an application from Aimee Louise Agombar for agreed removal from the NMC Register.

### **ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION**

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC Register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Aimee Louise Agombar's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person that made the allegation against Aimee Louise Agombar,
- submissions provided on behalf of Aimee Louise Agombar,
- Aimee Louise Agombar's reflective statement,
- investigation report and accompanying documents,
- the interests of Aimee Louise Agombar including the information she has provided about her health,
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Aimee Louise Agombar no longer intends to work as a registered nurse,
- in the circumstances, agreeing removal is in accordance with our guidance,
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time,
- the public interest is served by the immediate removal of Aimee Louise Agombar's name from the NMC Register.

This record of decision will be published for twelve months from the date of the decision, 04 April 2024. In the event that Aimee Louise Agombar seeks readmission to the Register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
