Nursing and Midwifery Council Agreed Removal Decision

On 29 May 2021 we received a referral raising a concern about Gaynor Mary Carey's fitness to practise. It's alleged that she failed to provide safe and effective patient care in March 2021 and May 2021 by: not carrying out full and appropriate patient assessments; not making a timely onward referrals; and failing to identify and implement the correct outcome/treatment required.

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to the investigation stage of our process. No allegation against Gaynor Mary Carey has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees. On 30 September 2023 we received an application from Gaynor Mary Carey for agreed removal from the NMC Register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC Register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Gaynor Mary Carey's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person that made the allegation against Gaynor Mary Carey
- Referral and documents related to the concerns
- the interests of Gaynor Mary Carey
- the public interest

I'm satisfied that:

- Gaynor Mary Carey no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Gaynor Mary Carey are not so serious as to be fundamentally incompatible with continued registration,
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time.
- the public interest is best served by the immediate removal of Gaynor Mary Carey's name from the NMC Register.

This record of decision will be published for twelve months from the date of the decision, 7 March 2024. In the event that Gaynor Mary Carey seeks readmission to the Register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
