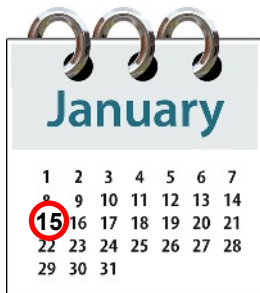

When care goes wrong



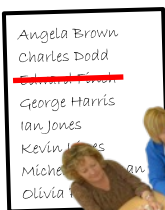
When care goes wrong we can look into this.

We also have hearings when someone thinks we were wrong to stop them from being on our list of nurses, midwives and nursing associates.



This year, coronavirus stopped us from having hearings with people meeting up.



So we did them over the internet instead.
