## Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to make an interim conditions of practice order for a period of 18 months.

The panel has determined that the following conditions are proportionate and appropriate:

1. You must limit your nursing practice to one substantive employer. This must not be an agency.
2. You must ensure that you are supervised by another registered nurse any time you are working. Your supervision must consist of working at all times while being directly observed by a registered nurse.
3. You must work with your supervisor or manager to create a personal development plan (PDP). Your PDP must address the concerns about medicines management, documentation, and your wider clinical practice. You must:
  - Send your case officer a copy of your PDP within one month of commencing your employment;
  - Meet with your supervisor or manager at least every month to discuss your progress towards achieving the aims set out in your PDP;
  - Send your case officer a report from your supervisor or manager prior to any NMC review hearing or meeting.

This report must show your progress towards achieving the aims set out in your PDP.

5. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
  - a. Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
  - b. Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.

6. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:
  - a. Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
  - b. Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.
  
7. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
  - a. Any organisation or person you work for.
  - b. Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
  - c. Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.
  - d. Any current or prospective patients or clients you intend to see or care for on a private basis when you are working in a self-employed capacity
  
8. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
  - a. Any clinical incident you are involved in.
  - b. Any investigation started against you.
  - c. Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.
  
9. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
  - a. Any current or future employer.
  - b. Any educational establishment.
  - c. Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions

Unless Mrs Akut's case has already been concluded, this interim order must be reviewed before the end of the next six months and every six months thereafter. Additionally, Mrs Akut or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed if any new evidence becomes available that may be relevant to the interim order.

At any review the reviewing panel may revoke the interim order or any condition of it, it may confirm the interim order, or vary any condition of it, or it may replace the interim conditions of practice order with an interim suspension order.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Mrs Akut. The NMC will write to Mrs Akut when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Mrs Akut in writing.
