## **Decision and reasons on interim order**

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. A reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the interim suspension order at this meeting and you will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, you are entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that you will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on your behalf or submit written representations about whether the interim order continues to be necessary. You must inform your case officer if you would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

At any such review hearing the reviewing panel may revoke the interim order, it may confirm the interim suspension order or it may replace it with an interim conditions of practice order.

You should notify the NMC immediately of any material change of circumstances that may affect the interim order. At any time, you or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed by a panel if any relevant new information becomes available.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against you. The NMC will write to you when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to you in writing.
