Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. A reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the interim order at this meeting and Miss Creedon will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Miss Creedon is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Miss Creedon will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on her behalf or submit written representations about whether the interim order continues to be necessary. Miss Creedon must inform her case officer if she would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

At any such review hearing the reviewing panel may revoke the interim order, it may confirm the interim suspension order or it may replace it with an interim conditions of practice order.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Miss Creedon. The NMC will write to Miss Creedon when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Miss Creedon in writing.
