Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to replace the current interim conditions of practice order with an interim suspension order.

The interim suspension order will replace the current interim conditions of practice order with immediate effect.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. A reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the interim suspension order at this meeting and Mr Pover will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Mr Pover is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Mr Pover will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on Mr Pover's behalf or submit written representations about whether the interim order continues to be necessary. Mr Pover must inform his case officer if he would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Mr Pover should notify the NMC immediately of any material change of circumstances that may affect the interim order.

At any time, Mr Pover or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed by a panel if any relevant new information becomes available.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Mr Pover. The NMC will write to Mr Pover when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Mr Pover in writing.

That concludes this determination.
