On 27 September 2022, we received a referral raising a concern about Rebecca Jayne Thomas's fitness to practise. It's alleged that Ms Thomas's fitness to practise is impaired by reason of convictions for assault and dangerous driving.

The matter was referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee for adjudication. No allegation against Rebecca Jayne Thomas has yet been found substantively proved. On 14 November 2023, we received an application from Rebecca Jayne Thomas for agreed removal from the NMC Register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC Register in this case for the following reasons.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Rebecca Jayne Thomas's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- Court records
- Documents provided by Rebecca Jayne Thomas, including a reflective statement and character witness statements
- the interests of Rebecca Jayne Thomas
- the public interest

I'm satisfied that:

- Rebecca Jayne Thomas no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- although the allegations against Rebecca Jayne Thomas are serious, in the particular circumstances of this case there is good reason not to consider them further at this time
- the public interest is best served by immediately removing Rebecca Jayne Thomas's name from the NMC Register.

This record of decision will be published for twelve months from the date of the decision, **15 March 2024**. In the event that Rebecca Jayne Thomas seeks

eadmission to the Register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed emoval further.
