## **Agreed Removal Decision**

**Registrant:** Jacqueline Dailey

**PIN:** 80J0677E

**Part(s) of the register:** Registered nurse

**Relevant Location:** Avon, Gloucestershire and Wiltshire

On 4 June 2024 we received a referral raising a concern about Jacqueline Dailey's fitness to practise. It's alleged that Jacqueline Dailey failed to administer anticonvulsants to Resident A on 30 September 2023 and incorrectly administered a dose of Methotrexate to Resident B on 30 May 2024. Jacqueline Dailey has admitted all the allegations against her.

We investigated the issue, and the matter was referred to Case Examiners. No allegation against Jacqueline Dailey has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 30 September 2025 we received an application from Jacqueline Dailey for agreed removal from the NMC register.

### **ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION**

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Jacqueline Dailey's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- We sought to contact the person who made the allegation against Jacqueline Dailey for their comments on the application for agreed removal. No comments were received within a reasonable period
- Jacqueline Dailey's statements dated 5 October 2023
- Jacqueline Dailey's Reflection dated 30 May 2024
- Case Examiner's Decision Letter dated 16 September 2025
- Agreed removal application form dated 30 September 2025
- the interests of Jacqueline Dailey
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Jacqueline Dailey no longer intends to work as a registered nurse

- the allegations against Jacqueline Dailey aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Jacqueline Dailey to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **9<sup>th</sup> December 2025** In the event that Jacqueline Dailey seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
