## **Agreed Removal Decision**

**Registrant:** Ian Andrew Claydon

**Part(s) of the register:** Registered Nurse - Mental Health (Level 2) Nursing

**Relevant Location:** Lancashire

On 2 February 2022 we received a referral raising a concern about Ian Andrew Claydon's fitness to practise. It's alleged that Mr Claydon used inappropriate restraint techniques on an elderly male resident with Dementia which has led to the regulatory concern that he failed to treat the resident with dignity.

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to Case Examination. No allegation against Ian Andrew Claydon has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 6 March 2025 we received an application from Ian Andrew Claydon for agreed removal from the NMC register.

### **ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION**

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Ian Andrew Claydon's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- Mr Claydon's application for agreed removal dated 6 March 2025 and supporting documentation
- Mr Claydon's response to Regulatory Concern dated 4 August 2023
- Case Examiner decision letter dated 9 October 2023
- Schedule of charge
- the interests of Ian Andrew Claydon
- the public interest.

We sought to contact the person who made the allegation against Ian Andrew Claydon for their comments on the application for agreed removal. No comments were received within a reasonable period.

I'm satisfied that:

- Ian Andrew Claydon no longer intends to work as a registered nurse

- the allegations against Ian Andrew Claydon aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Ian Andrew Claydon to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **24 June 2025**. In the event that Ian Andrew Claydon seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
