Nursing and Midwifery Council Agreed Removal Decision

On 30 December 2021 we received a referral raising a concern about Jayne Alison Platt's fitness to practise. The referral gave rise to a concern that Jayne Alison Platt has a health condition capable of impairing her fitness to practise. There were also concerns with Jayne Alison Platt's ability to administer medication safely, her ability to maintain adequate record keeping and provide safe and effective patient care.

Jayne Alison Platt accepts the concerns raised about her clinical practice.

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee. No allegation against Jayne Alison Platt has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 9 June 2025 we received an application from Jayne Alison Platt for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Jayne Alison Platt's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- agreed removal application form dated 8 April 2025 and supporting documentation
- schedule of charge
- case examiner decision letter dated 7 November 2024
- report to the case examiners and the documentation obtained as part of the NMC investigation.
- the interests of Jayne Alison Platt
- the public interest.

We sought to contact the person who made the allegation against Jayne Alison Platt for their comments on the application for agreed removal. No comments were received within a reasonable period.

I'm satisfied that:

- Jayne Alison Platt no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Jayne Alison Platt aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Jayne Alison Platt to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, 23 June 2025. In the event that Jayne Alison Platt seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
