## Agreed Removal Decision

On 26 July 2022, we received a referral raising a concern about Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun's fitness to practise. The concern involved a number of failings in Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun's leadership and management of a care home which exposed the home's residents to harm or neglect.

Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun made admissions to some of the concerns. He said that there was a lot of responsibility in his role, it was very stressful and he felt limited in his ability to carry out his role to its full capacity due to the operational arrangements in the care home.

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee. The Fitness to Practise Committee considered the case and made findings of fact. The hearing adjourned before the impairment stage could be reached.

During the Fitness to Practise Committee hearing, Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun made an application for agreed removal from the NMC register.

### ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun
- the Fitness to Practise Committee's reasons
- the interests of Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun
- the public interest.

I've taken account of advice from the Fitness to Practise Committee in reaching this decision.

I'm satisfied that:

- Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **19 November 2025**. In the event that Alexander Lancelot Banson-Idun seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
