Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

The panel has determined that the following conditions are proportionate and appropriate:

- You must limit your practice to one substantive employer. This must not be an agency or bank work.
- You must ensure that you are supervised by another registered nurse any time you are administering medication until you have been assessed as competent to do so without supervision. A copy of your completed competency must be sent to the NMC within seven days of completion.
- You must be indirectly supervised by another registered nurse at all
 other times when working as a nurse. This must consist of working at
 all times on the same shift as, but not always directly observed by,
 another registered nurse.
- You must meet with your line manager or supervisor monthly to discuss:
 - a) Medication management and administration
 - b) Record keeping
 - c) Communication with colleagues
 - d) [PRIVATE]
 - e) You must also keep a reflective profile in relation to how you would respond or how you have responded in a similar or challenging situation.
- 5. You must obtain a report from your line manager or supervisor and send it to your NMC case officer at least seven days before any review hearing detailing your performance in relation to:
 - a) Medication management and administration

- b) Record keeping
- c) Communication with colleagues
- d) [PRIVATE]
- e) Your reflective profile
- 6. [PRIVATE]
- 7. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
 - Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
 - b) Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.
- 8. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:
 - Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
 - b) Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.
- 9. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
 - a) Any organisation or person you work for.
 - b) Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
 - c) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.
- 10. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
 - a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
 - b) Any investigation started against you.
 - c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.

- 11. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
 - a) Any current or future employer.
 - b) Any educational establishment.
 - Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions.

The panel decided to confirm this interim conditions of practice order and it will run for the remainder of the current interim order.

Unless Miss Butlin's case has already been concluded, this interim order must be reviewed before the end of the next six months and every six months thereafter. Additionally, Miss Butlin or the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) may ask for the interim order to be reviewed if any new evidence becomes available that may be relevant to the interim order.

At any review a panel may revoke the interim order or any condition of it, it may confirm the interim order, or vary any condition of it, or it may replace the interim conditions of practice order with an interim suspension order.

A panel of the Fitness to Practise Committee has still to deal with the allegations made against Miss Butlin. The NMC will keep Miss Butlin informed of developments in relation to that issue.

This will be confirmed to Miss Butlin in writing.

That concludes this determination.
