Agreed Removal Decision

On 30 January 2025, we received a referral raising a concern about Lori Orrock's fitness to practise. The concern was about the way Lori Orrock offered and carried out aesthetics treatments. It's alleged that she:

- failed to ensure that face to face prescription consultations took place for patients under her care
- injected herself with prescription only medication
- held prescription only medications in stock despite not being a non-medical prescriber
- administered non-UK approved aesthetics treatments from online retailers
- administered aesthetics treatments in a non-sterile environment
- failed to follow proper infection control measures.

Lori Orrock doesn't accept the concerns and told us that the allegations are malicious and an attempt to ruin her business and career.

The NMC investigation isn't finished and no allegation against Lori Orrock has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 26 June 2025, we received an application from Lori Orrock for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Lori Orrock's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Lori Orrock
- the referral and other information obtained so far
- the interests of Lori Orrock
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Lori Orrock no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- there's enough information to understand the full extent of the regulatory concerns and make a fully informed decision about the removal application
- the allegations against Lori Orrock aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Lori Orrock to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **2 October 2025**. In the event that Lori Orrock seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
