Agreed Removal Decision

On 2 April 2024 we received a referral raising a concern about Selina Amara Metu's fitness to practise. It's alleged that Selina Amara Metu's fitness to practise is impaired due to a lack of competence and this is demonstrated by various issues with her clinical practice, in areas including medications administration, recognising and dealing with deteriorating patients, undertaking appropriate observations, applying dressings, record keeping and giving handovers.

Selina Amara Metu doesn't accept the concerns with her practice, other than those relating to record keeping.

We investigated the issues and the matter was referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee stage of our process. No allegation against Selina Amara Metu has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 26 July 2025 we received an application from Selina Amara Metu for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Selina Amara Metu's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person that made the allegation against Selina Amara Metu
- documents and information gathered during our investigations and Selina Amara Metu's response to the allegations
- the interests of Selina Amara Metu
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Selina Amara Metu no longer intends to work as a registered nurse

- the allegations against Selina Amara Metu aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Selina Amara Metu to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, 16 September 2025. In the event that Selina Amara Metu seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
