## Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

Therefore, the panel confirmed the following conditions:

'For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, 'course of study' and 'course' mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must limit your nursing practice to one substantive employer which must not be an agency. This can be for one substantive employer as a bank nurse.
2. You must not be the nurse in charge of a shift or the sole nurse on duty.
3. You must ensure that you are supervised any time you are working. Your supervision must consist of working at all times on the same shift as, but not always directly observed by another registered nurse.
4. You must not undertake any physical restraint of a patient unless responding to an emergency situation.
5. You must have monthly meetings with your line manager, mentor or nominated supervisor to discuss your practice and in particular your response and coping mechanisms to emergency and escalating situations.
6. You must obtain a report from your line manager, mentor or nominated supervisor commenting on your monthly meetings. This report must be provided to the NMC prior to any review hearing
7. You must keep us informed about anywhere you are working by:

- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
  - b) Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.
8. You must keep us informed about anywhere you are studying by:
- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
  - b) Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.
9. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
- a) Any organisation or person you work for.
  - b) Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
  - c) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.
10. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
- a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
  - b) Any investigation started against you.
  - c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.
11. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
- a) Any current or future employer.
  - b) Any educational establishment.
  - c) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions

Unless Mr Attafuah case has already been concluded or there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim conditions of practice order at a review meeting within the next six months and every six months thereafter. A panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the interim conditions of practice at this meeting and Mr Attafuah will be notified of the panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, or there has been a request for an early review, a panel will review the interim order at a hearing which Mr Attafuah will be invited to attend in person, send a representative on Mr Attafuah's behalf or submit written representations for the panel to consider. At any such review hearing the panel may revoke the interim order, it may confirm the interim conditions of practice order or it may replace it with an interim suspension order.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Mr Attafuah. The NMC will write to Mr Attafuah when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Mr Attafuah in writing.
