Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

As such it has determined that the following conditions remain proportionate and appropriate:

'For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, 'course of study' and 'course' mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must limit your nursing practice to a single substantive employer. This can be through an agency but must be in a single clinical setting for a minimum period of three months.
2. You must ensure that you are supervised any time you are working. Your supervision must consist of working at all times on the same shift as, but not always directly observed by, a registered nurse.
3. You must not be the nurse in charge of any shift.
4. When starting a new role as a registered nurse, you must meet with your line manager, mentor or supervisor to develop a performance plan to enable you to demonstrate your competence as a Band 5 registered nurse.
5. You must meet monthly with your line manager, mentor or supervisor to discuss
 - a) your progress as a Band 5 registered nurse
 - b) [PRIVATE]

6. You will send the NMC a report in advance of the next NMC hearing or meeting from your line manager, mentor or supervisor that comments on the following areas:
 - a) your progress as a Band 5 registered nurse
 - b) [PRIVATE]

7. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
 - a. Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
 - b. Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.

8. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:
 - a. Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
 - b. Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.

9. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
 - a. Any organisation or person you work for.
 - b. Any agency you apply to or are registered with for work.
 - c. Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
 - d. Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.

10. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:

- a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
- b) Any investigation started against you.
- c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.

11. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:

- a) Any current or future employer.
- b) Any educational establishment.
- c) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the order at this meeting and Ms Birungi will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Ms Birungi is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Ms Birungi will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on her behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Ms Birungi must inform her case officer if she would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Ms Birungi does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel will review the order at a hearing to which Ms Birungi and her representative will be invited to attend.

This decision will be confirmed to Ms Birungi in writing.

That concludes this determination.
