Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

As such it has determined that the following conditions remain proportionate and appropriate:

‘For the purposes of these conditions, ‘employment’ and ‘work’ mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, ‘course of study’ and ‘course’ mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must only work for one substantive employer or if placed through an agency a minimum 6 months placement in one location.
2. You must not be the registered nurse in charge or sole nurse on duty.
3. You must not manage or administer medication unless directly supervised by another registered nurse senior to you.
4. You must not manage or administer medication independently until you have been assessed as competent by a nurse senior to you. You must provide the NMC with a copy of your medication competency assessment within 7 days of passing it/them.
5. You must ensure that you are indirectly supervised any time you are working. Your supervision must consist of working at all times on the same shift as, but not always directly observed, by another registered nurse.

6. You must meet with your line manager/mentor/supervisor fortnightly. You must develop an action plan to address and confirm your competence in the following areas:
 - Medication management
 - Communication
 - Record keeping
 - Managing time/prioritising work
 - Infection control

7. You must provide the NMC with a recent progress report on this action plan prior to any review commenting on the areas of concern listed below:
 - Medication management
 - Communication
 - Record keeping
 - Managing time/prioritising work
 - Infection control

9. Prior to any review you should send any reports produced by your occupational health department to the NMC.

10. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
 - a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
 - b) Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.

11. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:
 - a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
 - b) Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.

12. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
 - a) Any organisation or person you work for.
 - b) Any agency you apply to or are registered with for work.
 - c) Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
 - d) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.

13. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
 - a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
 - b) Any investigation started against you.
 - c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.

14. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
 - a) Any current or future employer.
 - b) Any educational establishment.
 - c) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the order at this meeting and Mr Donnelly will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Mr Donnelly is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Mr Donnelly will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on his behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Mr Donnelly must inform his case officer if he would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Mr Donnelly does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel will review the order at a hearing to which Mr Donnelly and his representative will be invited to attend.

This decision will be confirmed to Mr Donnelly in writing.

That concludes this determination.
