## **Decision and reasons on interim order**

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

The panel determined that the public would remain suitably protected by the continuation of the following conditions:

‘For the purposes of these conditions, ‘employment’ and ‘work’ mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, ‘course of study’ and ‘course’ mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must provide the NMC with an update report showing your progress and improvement addressing every element of each regulatory concern, as set out within this determination, prior to any review hearing.
2. You must meet monthly for clinical supervision with a supervisor who is a registered healthcare professional with knowledge of the aesthetics practice and is independent of your business. This monthly supervision must include your progress and improvements in relation to every element of each regulatory concern.
3. You must send a report from your clinical supervisor in relation to every element of each regulatory concerns to your NMC case officer prior to any review hearing.
4. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
  - a) Any organisation or person you work for.
  - b) Any agency you apply to or are registered with for work.

- c) Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
  - d) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.
  - e) Any current or prospective patients or clients you intend to see or care for on a private basis when you are working in a self-employed capacity
5. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
  - b) Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.
6. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
- a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
  - b) Any investigation started against you.
  - c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.
7. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
- a) Any current or future employer.
  - b) Any educational establishment.
  - c) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions'.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim conditions of practice order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the order at this

meeting and Ms Green will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Ms Green is entitled to have the interim conditions of practice order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Ms Green will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on her behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Ms Green must inform her case officer if she would like the interim conditions of practice order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Ms Green does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel will review the order at a hearing to which Ms Green and her representative will be invited to attend.

This decision will be confirmed to Ms Green in writing.
