Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

The panel has determined that the following conditions are proportionate and appropriate:

'For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, 'course of study' and 'course' mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must limit your practice as a registered nurse to one substantive employer for a period of no less than six months. This must not be through an agency or bank.
2. You must not be the nurse in charge on any shift.
3. You must not be the sole nurse on duty at any time.
4. You must ensure that you are supervised by a Band 6 or above registered nurse any time you are working. Your supervision must consist of working at all times on the same shift as, but not always directly observed by, a registered nurse of Band 6 or above.
5. You must be directly supervised by a Band 6 or above registered nurse any time you are administering or managing medication, until you are signed off as competent. You must provide the NMC with the certificate of completion within 7 days of being signed off.
6. You must meet with your line manager, mentor or supervisor fortnightly to discuss and reflect upon your clinical practice with particular regard to the following areas:
 - a) Communication

- b) Medication administration and management
 - c) Record keeping
 - d) Prioritisation of tasks
 - e) Development and implementation of a plan of care
 - f) Escalation
7. You must provide a report to the NMC 7 days before your review hearing from your line manager, mentor or supervisor on your reflection and clinical practice with specific reference to the following areas:
- a) Communications
 - b) Medication administration and management
 - c) Record keeping
 - d) Prioritisation of tasks
 - e) Development and implementation of a plan of care
 - f) Escalation
8. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
 - b) Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.
9. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:
- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
 - b) Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.
10. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:

- a) Any organisation or person you work for.
 - b) Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
 - c) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.
11. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
- a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
 - b) Any investigation started against you.
 - c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.
12. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
- a) Any current or future employer.
 - b) Any educational establishment.
 - c) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions

Unless Mr Magaton's case has already been concluded or there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim conditions of practice order at a review meeting within the next six months and every six months thereafter. A panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the interim conditions of practice order at this meeting and Mr Magaton will be notified of the panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, or there has been a request for an early review, a panel will review the interim order at a hearing which Mr Magaton will be invited to attend in person, send a representative on Mr Magaton's behalf or submit written representations for the panel to consider. At any such review hearing the panel may revoke the interim

order, it may confirm the interim conditions of practice order or it may replace it with an interim suspension order.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Mr Magaton. The NMC will write to Mr Magaton when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Mr Magaton in writing.

That concludes this determination.
