## **Agreed Removal Decision**

**Registrant:** Corah B Mckenna

**Part(s) of the register:** Registered Nurse - Adult Nursing

**Relevant Location:** Kent

On 7 February 2024 we received a referral raising a concern about Corah B Mckenna's fitness to practise. It's alleged that she lacked competence in the areas of medication administration, record-keeping, time management and communicating with colleagues. It's also alleged that her behaviour towards colleagues was intimidating.

Corah B Mckenna accepts that on one occasion she administered controlled drugs without a second checker. She says that this was because they were short-staffed and she reported the incident when it happened. She denies all the other concerns raised about her practice.

We investigated the concerns but they haven't yet been considered by the case examiners. No allegation against Corah B Mckenna has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 5 August 2024 we received an application from Corah B Mckenna for agreed removal from the NMC register.

### **ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION**

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Corah B Mckenna's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- the evidence we've obtained in our investigation
- comments received from the person that made the allegation against Corah B Mckenna
- the interests of Corah B Mckenna
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Corah B Mckenna no longer intends to work as a registered nurse

- the allegations against Corah B Mckenna aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Corah B Mckenna to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, 28 April 2026. In the event that Corah B Mckenna seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
