## **Decision and reasons on interim order**

The panel decided to confirm the current interim suspension order.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the order at this meeting and Mr Mundembe will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Mr Mundembe is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Mr Mundembe will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on his behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Mr Mundembe must inform his case officer if he would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Mr Mundembe does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel will review the order at a hearing to which Mr Mundembe and his representative will be invited to attend.

This decision will be confirmed to Mr Mundembe in writing.
