Agreed Removal Decision

On 8 April 2024 we received a referral raising a concern about Brenna Allsuch's fitness to practise. It's alleged that she:

- misappropriated a strip of medication
- left keys in a patient's room and left the drug trolley open
- made medication administration errors
- gave incorrect medical advice about a subcutaneous injection
- failed to administer medications in a timely manner.

During the course of the investigation further concerns came to light that Brenna Allsuch:

- failed to maintain adequate standards of record keeping
- failed to escalate clinical issues when carrying out pre-assessment checks
- incorrectly advised a patient about their results
- failed to inform a patient when to stop their medication
- and failed to give MSSA treatment to a patient who had tested positive.

We referred the matter to the case examiners and we're in the process of investigating the concerns. No allegation against Brenna Allsuch has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

Brenna Allsuch explained that it was not her intention to be dishonest when she had taken the incorrect medication but she accepts that her behaviour fell below the standards expected of a registered nurse.

On 11 March 2026 we received an application from Brenna Allsuch for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Brenna Allsuch's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Brenna Allsuch dated 31 March 2026
- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Brenna Allsuch dated 27 April 2026
- agreed removal application form and supporting documentation
- information obtained from the investigation to date
- reflective statement of Brenna Allsuch
- the interests of Brenna Allsuch
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Brenna Allsuch no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- although serious, the allegations against Brenna Allsuch aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Brenna Allsuch to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, 11 August 2026. In the event that Brenna Allsuch seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
