Agreed Removal Decision

Registrant: Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies

Part(s) of the register: Registered Nurse - Adult Nursing

Relevant Location: West Glamorgan

On 16 February 2024 we received a referral raising a concern about Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies's fitness to practise. On 22 August 2024 Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies appeared at West Glamorgan Magistrates' Court where she pleaded guilty to and was convicted of the following offences.

- Making a False Instrument x 3, contrary to sections 1 and 6 of the Forgery and Counterfeiting Act 1981.
- Theft of Zopiclone tablets from Cyril Evans Ward at Morriston Hospital, contrary to section 1(1) and 7 of the Theft Act 1968.
- Theft of NHS WP10 prescriptions, contrary to section 1(1) and 7 of the Theft Act 1968.

On 8 November 2024 at Swansea Crown Court Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies was sentenced to 12 months imprisonment suspended for 18 months, a 12-month Mental Health Order, 150 hours of unpaid work and 15 days Rehabilitation Activity.

Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies accepts the concerns raised against her.

Our investigation into the concerns isn't complete and the matter hasn't yet been considered by the case examiners. No allegation against Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 27 June 2025 we received an application from Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- documents obtained so far in our investigation

- the specific circumstances surrounding Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies's offending including that there was no evidence she was supplying medication to anyone else
- there's no evidence that Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies put people receiving care at a direct risk of harm
- Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies has apologised for her conduct and shown insight into its impact on the reputation of the profession
- Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies pleaded guilty and was sentenced for her offences at a public court hearing
- the interests of Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies
- the public interest.

We contacted the person who made the allegation against Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies for their comments on the application for agreed removal. No comments were received within a reasonable period.

I'm satisfied that:

- Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- although serious, in the circumstances of this case the allegations against Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, 9 February 2026. In the event that Laura Elizabeth Barbara Davies seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
