## Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

'For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, 'course of study' and 'course' mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must keep your employment to one substantive employer. No bank or agency work.
2. You must not be the sole nurse on duty or the nurse in charge of any shift.
3. You must be directly supervised in relation to the management and administration of medication until a medicine competency assessment has been undertaken and passed by you. A band 6 nurse or above must then deem you competent to work in this area independently.
4. You must provide evidence of having passed the medicine competency assessment and provide this to your NMC case officer within 7 days of achievement.
5. You must have fortnightly meetings with your line manager, nominated supervisor or mentor to discuss your:
  - medication management and administration
  - [PRIVATE]
6. You must obtain a report from your line manager, nominated supervisor or mentor before any review hearing commenting on your:
  - medication management and administration
  - [PRIVATE]

11. You must keep us informed about anywhere you are working by:

- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
- b) Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.

12. You must keep us informed about anywhere you are studying by:

- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
- b) Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.

13. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:

- a) Any organisation or person you work for.
- b) Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
- c) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.

14. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:

- a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
- b) Any investigation started against you.
- c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.

15. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
- a) Any current or future employer.
  - b) Any educational establishment.
  - c) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions.'

Unless Mrs Meyrick's case has already been concluded or there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim conditions of practice order at a review meeting within the next six months and every six months thereafter. A panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the interim conditions of practice order at this meeting and Mrs Meyrick will be notified of the panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, or there has been a request for an early review, a panel will review the interim order at a hearing which Mrs Meyrick will be invited to attend in person, send a representative on Mrs Meyrick's behalf or submit written representations for the panel to consider. At any such review hearing the panel may revoke the interim order, it may confirm the interim conditions of practice order or it may replace it with an interim conditions of practice order.

This will be confirmed to Mrs Meyrick in writing.
