## **Decision and reasons on interim order**

The panel decided to confirm the current interim suspension order

Unless Miss Sullivan's case has already been concluded or there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at a review meeting within the next six months and every six months thereafter. A panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the interim suspension order at this meeting and Miss Sullivan will be notified of the panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, or there has been a request for an early review, a panel will review the interim order at a hearing which Miss Sullivan will be invited to attend in person, send a representative on Miss Sullivan's behalf or submit written representations for the panel to consider. At any such review hearing the panel may revoke the interim order, it may confirm the interim suspension order or it may replace it with an interim conditions of practice order.

Accordingly, the panel was satisfied that the order remains necessary on the same grounds and for the same reasons as previously stated by the Investigating Committee panel at the last review on 4 September 2025.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the order at this meeting and Miss Sullivan will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Miss Sullivan is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Miss Sullivan will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on her behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Miss Sullivan must inform her case officer if she would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Miss Sullivan does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel will review the order at a hearing to which Miss Sullivan and her representative will be invited to attend.

This decision will be confirmed to Miss Sullivan in writing.
