Agreed Removal Decision

On 26 June 2023 we received a referral raising a concern about Kirsty Dellow's fitness to practise. It's alleged that Ms Dellow made medication errors and failed to record medication appropriately.

We investigated the issue, and the matter was referred to the Case Examiners. No allegation against Kirsty Dellow has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 11 September 2025 we received an application from Kirsty Dellow for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Kirsty Dellow's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- Application from Kirsty Dellow for agreed removal and documents contained within the Case Examiner bundle
- the decision by the Case Examiners
- the interests of Kirsty Dellow
- the public interest.

We sought to contact the person who made the allegation against Kirsty Dellow for their comments on the application for agreed removal. No comments were received within a reasonable period.

I'm satisfied that:

- Kirsty Dellow no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Kirsty Dellow aren't likely to result in a striking-off order

- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Kirsty Dellow to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **8th January 2026** In the event that Kirsty Dellow seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
