## **Decision and reasons on interim order**

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

‘For the purposes of these conditions, ‘employment’ and ‘work’ mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, ‘course of study’ and ‘course’ mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must confine your nursing practice to Barts Health NHS Trust.
2. You must not undertake any bank work.
3. You must only work in a non-clinical role.
4. You must keep the NMC and Barts Health NHS Trust informed of any progress in your criminal case.
5. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
  - a) Telling your case officer within seven days of leaving your employment.
  - b) Giving your case officer your employer’s contact details.
6. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:
  - a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
  - b) Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.

7. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
  - a) Barts Health NHS Trust.
  - b) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.
8. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
  - a) Any investigation started against you.
  - b) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.
9. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
  - a) Barts Health NHS Trust
  - b) Any educational establishment you are enrolled in/or applying to.'

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim conditions of practice order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the order at this meeting and Mr Kausar will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Mr Kausar is entitled to have the interim conditions of practice order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Mr Kausar will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on his behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Mr Kausar must inform his case officer if he would like the interim conditions of practice order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Mr Kausar does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel

will review the order at a hearing to which Mr Kausar and his representative will be invited to attend.

This decision will be confirmed to Mr Kausar in writing.
