## **Agreed Removal Decision**

**Registrant:** Suzanne Mannix

**PIN:** 07B3022E

**Part(s) of the register:** Registered Nurse - Learning Disabilities Nursing

**Relevant Location:** West Yorkshire

On 14 April 2025 we received a referral raising a concern about Suzanne Mannix's fitness to practise. It's alleged that Suzanne Mannix:

- failed to carry out adequate patient assessment as she moved a resident from the floor without completing a thorough assessment and while using an inappropriate moving and handling technique
- falsified documentation stating that the resident was able to weight bear and was assisted by four staff members following the fall.

The referral is at the early stages of the investigation and is yet to be considered by the case examiners. No allegation against Suzanne Mannix has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

Suzanne Mannix reflected on her actions and recognises that she should have used a hoist to assist the resident. She denies falsifying records and maintains that she made a mistake in what she had written and did not attempt to deliberately mislead.

On 9 September 2025 we received an application from Suzanne Mannix for agreed removal from the NMC register.

### **ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION**

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Suzanne Mannix's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person that made the allegation against Suzanne Mannix dated 14 October 2025
- referral documentation and supporting documentation
- the interests of Suzanne Mannix
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Suzanne Mannix no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- there's enough information to make a decision about the seriousness of the concerns and the public interest in removing Suzanne Mannix from the register at this stage of the investigation
- although serious, the allegations against Suzanne Mannix aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Suzanne Mannix to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **13 January 2026**. In the event that Suzanne Mannix seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
