## **Agreed Removal Decision**

**Registrant:** Philip Banks

**PIN:** 99D0469E

**Part(s) of the register:** Registered Nurse - Mental Health Nursing

**Relevant Location:** Wiltshire

On 20 November 2025 we received a referral raising a concern about Philip Banks' fitness to practise alleging that he:

- inappropriately delegated patient care and/or medication administration to care staff
- made inadequate and/or inaccurate record evidencing that he delegated tasks to care staff
- failed to follow controlled drugs policy by administering controlled drugs without a witness.
- failure to safeguard those in his care by sleeping on duty.

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to the case examiners. The case examiners are yet to consider the concerns raised.

No allegation against Philip Banks has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

Philip Banks accepts some of the concerns raised about his practice, for example he accepted that he delegated patient care and administration to care staff.

On 28 March 2026 we received an application from Philip Banks for agreed removal from the NMC register.

### **ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION**

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Philip Banks' application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- agreed removal application dated 28 March 2026 and supporting documentation
- report to the case examiners and accompanying documentation
- the interests of Philip Banks

- the public interest.

We invited the person who made the allegation against Philip Banks to comment on the application for agreed removal. No comments were received by the time the application was considered.

I'm satisfied that:

- Philip Banks no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Philip Banks aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Philip Banks to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **27 July 2026**. In the event that Philip Banks seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
