Agreed Removal Decision

Registrant: Jinku Mary Joseph

Part(s) of the register: Registered Nurse - Adult Nursing

On 31 March 2025 we received a referral raising a concern about Jinku Mary Joseph's fitness to practise. It's alleged that she lacked competence in patient care, medication administration, assessing patients, escalating deteriorating patients, record keeping and communication. Jinku Mary Joseph denies the concerns.

We investigated the issues and the case examiners decided to offer Jinku Mary Joseph undertakings as a pathway back to safe practice. Jinku Mary Joseph told us she no longer wanted to practise as a nurse and on 7 May 2026 she sent us an application for agreed removal from the NMC register. As Jinku Mary Joseph didn't accept the undertakings the matter was referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee. No allegation against Jinku Mary Joseph has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Jinku Mary Joseph's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- the documents we obtained during our investigation
- the case examiners' decision letter dated 21 April 2026, offering undertakings
- the letter to Miss Joseph dated 9 June 2026 explaining that because she didn't accept the undertakings her case would be referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee
- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Jinku Mary Joseph
- the interests of Jinku Mary Joseph
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Jinku Mary Joseph no longer intends to work as a registered nurse in the UK

- the allegations against Jinku Mary Joseph aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Jinku Mary Joseph to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **23 July 2026**. In the event that Jinku Mary Joseph seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
