Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim suspension order.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the order at this meeting and Ms Mckevitt will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Ms Mckevitt is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Ms Mckevitt will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on her behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Ms Mckevitt must inform her case officer if she would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Ms Mckevitt does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel will review the order at a hearing to which Ms Mckevitt and her representative will be invited to attend.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Ms Mckevitt. The NMC will write to Ms Mckevitt when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Ms Mckevitt in writing.
