Agreed Removal Decision

Registrant: Kimberley Jane Turton

Part(s) of the register: Registered Nurse - Adult Nursing

Relevant Location: West Yorkshire

On 4 March 2025 we received a referral raising a concern about Kimberley Jane Turton's fitness to practise. It's alleged that she:

- added her own signature to another colleague's investigation statement
- failed to take appropriate steps following an allegation of sexual abuse
- failed to appropriately escalate, refer and/or manage a resident's grade three pressure sore
- failed to obtain informed consent from residents when taking blood from them
- did not make adequate and/or any records in regard to taking blood from residents
- acted outside her scope of practice in that she took blood when she was not permitted to under the CQC registration and was not insured to do.
- failed to appropriately dispose of used sharp(s).

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to the case examiners. The case examiners are yet to consider the concerns raised.

Kimberley Jane Turton accepts some of the concerns and has reflected on the concerns raised about her practice.

No allegation against Kimberley Jane Turton has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 18 March 2026 we received an application from Kimberley Jane Turton for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Kimberley Jane Turton's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Kimberley Jane Turton dated 15 April 2026
- agreed removal application dated 18 March 2026
- report to the case examiners and accompanying documentation
- the interests of Kimberley Jane Turton
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Kimberley Jane Turton no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Kimberley Jane Turton aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Kimberley Jane Turton to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **27 July 2026**. In the event that Kimberley Jane Turton seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
