Agreed Removal Decision

Registrant: Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty

On 19 April 2022, we received a referral raising a concern about Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty's fitness to practise. It's alleged that Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty made errors in the areas of:

- patient assessment and monitoring
- administration of medication
- record keeping.

Ina Crawford-Carty accepts making errors during the relevant period. She said that they were a consequence of extreme and prolonged workplace pressures that compromised her wellbeing and ability to function safely.

We investigated the issue and a set of undertakings were agreed as a pathway back to safe practice. The undertakings were varied and extended in September 2024.

No allegation against Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 31 January 2026, we received an application from Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- the agreed removal application form
- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty
- the reasons for the decisions to agree and subsequently vary undertakings
- the interests of Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **30 April 2026**. In the event that Ina Eulene Crawford-Carty seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
