Agreed Removal Decision

On 28 January 2026 we received a referral raising a concern about Georg-Mary Okpala's fitness to practise. The concerns relate to poor medications practice. It's alleged that Georg-Mary Okpala:

- left medication unattended where residents could have accessed it
- gave medication to a resident that was labelled for a different resident.

Georg-Mary Okpala doesn't clearly admit the concerns, but says that leaving that type of medication in residents' rooms was widespread at her place of work.

The matter is still in the Screening stage of our fitness to practise process and we've not yet finished our investigation. No allegation against Georg-Mary Okpala has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 24 February 2026 we received an application from Georg-Mary Okpala for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Georg-Mary Okpala's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- agreed removal application form
- documents obtained during the fitness to practise process
- the interests of Georg-Mary Okpala
- the public interest.

We sought to contact the people who made the allegation against Georg-Mary Okpala for their comments on the application for agreed removal. No comments were received within a reasonable period.

I'm satisfied that:

- I've enough information to understand the full seriousness of the concerns and make a decision on the public interest in removing Georg-Mary Okpala from the NMC register
- Georg-Mary Okpala no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Georg-Mary Okpala aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Georg-Mary Okpala to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **16 June 2026**. In the event that Georg-Mary Okpala seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
