Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to replace the current interim conditions of practice order with an interim suspension order.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. A reviewing panel will be invited by the NMC to confirm the interim suspension order at this meeting and Mrs Ross-Read will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Mrs Ross-Read is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Mrs Ross-Read will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on Mrs Ross-Read's behalf or submit written representations about whether the interim order continues to be necessary. Mrs Ross-Read must inform her case officer if she would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Mrs Ross-Read does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the interim suspension order should be revoked or replaced, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at a hearing which Mrs Ross-Read and her representative will be invited to attend.

Mrs Ross-Read should notify the NMC immediately of any material change of circumstances that may affect the interim order.

At any time, Mrs Ross-Read or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed by a panel if any relevant new information becomes available.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Mrs Ross-Read. The NMC will write to Mrs Ross-Read when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Mrs Ross-Read in writing.
