Agreed Removal Decision

On 17 October 2023 we received a referral raising a concern about Tabitha Lowe's fitness to practise. It's alleged that she accessed a patient's medical records without clinical justification and shared the medical information within a witness statement. It's also alleged that Tabitha Lowe was dishonest as she knew some of the information within the witness statement was not accurate.

Tabitha Lowe denies accessing patient records without clinical justification. She accepts that she shared medical information within a witness statement, however says that she was required to do this. She denies the allegation of dishonesty.

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee. No allegation against Tabitha Lowe has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 20 February 2026 we received an application from Tabitha Lowe for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Tabitha Lowe's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person that made the allegation against Tabitha Lowe
- Tabitha Lowe's agreed removal application and supporting documents
- reasons for the decision to send the case to the Fitness to Practise Committee
- documents obtained during the investigation of the matters
- the interests of Tabitha Lowe
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Tabitha Lowe no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- while dishonesty and accessing records without clinical justification are serious concerns, taking into account that it was an isolated incident and Tabitha Lowe's insight and reflection, the allegations aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Tabitha Lowe to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **16 March 2026**. In the event that Tabitha Lowe seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
