Agreed Removal Decision

On 12 August 2025, we received a referral raising a concern about Lisa Marie Maidment's fitness to practise. It's alleged that, while working as a Practice Nurse Lead at a GP surgery, Lisa Marie Maidment:

- acted outside her scope of competence
- failed to escalate patients and seek clinical authorisation/input when needed
- failed to make adequate records
- demonstrated poor hygiene and infection control
- failed to monitor fridge temperatures
- was given time off work and made parking and mileage claims for training courses she didn't attend.

Lisa Marie Maidment hasn't commented on all of the issues but said that she is very disappointed in herself. She strongly denies acting dishonestly and said that there were occasions she was unable to attend study days but she made the HR manager aware and didn't claim for these.

The case has been referred to the case examiners but the NMC investigation isn't finished. No allegation against Lisa Marie Maidment has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 30 January 2026, we received an application from Lisa Marie Maidment for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Lisa Marie Maidment's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- agreed removal application form and supporting documents
- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Lisa Marie Maidment

- information and evidence gathered during the NMC investigation so far
- the alleged dishonesty doesn't involve vulnerable victims or pose a direct risk to patients and is not at the most serious end of the scale of dishonest conduct
- the interests of Lisa Marie Maidment
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Lisa Marie Maidment no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- there's enough information to make a decision about agreeing removal from the NMC register without completing our investigation
- in all the circumstances, a striking-off order is not a likely or necessary outcome
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Lisa Marie Maidment to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **26 March 2026**. In the event that Lisa Marie Maidment seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
