Agreed Removal Decision

Registrant: Linda Catherine Morris

On 19 March 2025, we received a referral raising a concern about Linda Catherine Morris' fitness to practise. It's alleged that Linda Catherine Morris failed to demonstrate the standards of knowledge, skill and judgement to practise without supervision as a Band 6 Occupational Health Nurse.

Linda Catherine Morris hasn't clearly indicated whether she accepts the concerns or not but said that she didn't have any training for her role. She also said that she's not on the register as an Occupational Health Nurse and although she worked in the Occupational Health Department, she was employed as a Registered Nurse, not a specialist.

The matter was referred to the case examiners but the NMC investigation isn't finished.

On 26 February 2026, we received an application from Linda Catherine Morris for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Linda Catherine Morris' application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- the agreed removal application form and supporting information
- comments received from the person who made the allegation against Linda Catherine Morris
- the NMC referral form and supporting documents
- the interests of Linda Catherine Morris
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Linda Catherine Morris no longer intends to work as a registered nurse

- there's enough information to make a decision about the seriousness of the concerns and the public interest in agreeing removal without completing our investigation
- the allegations against Linda Catherine Morris aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Linda Catherine Morris to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **7 May 2026**. In the event that Linda Catherine Morris seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
