Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

The panel determined that the following conditions are proportionate and appropriate:

For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, 'course of study' and 'course' mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must restrict your nursing practice to one substantive employer which must not be an agency or involve any bank work.
2. You must not be the sole nurse in charge or the nurse in charge of any shift at any time.
3. You must only practise as part of a preceptorship programme or equivalent. The arrangements under which you practise must include direct supervision at all times until assessed as competent to practise independently in each clinical skill.
4. You must meet with your line manager or supervisor on a fortnightly basis to discuss the following areas:
 - a. [PRIVATE]
 - b. Your progress in developing clinical skills
 - c. Communication and teamwork
5. You must provide a report from your line manager or supervisor to the NMC prior to any review hearing in relation to the following areas:
 - a. [PRIVATE]
 - b. Your progress in developing clinical skills
 - c. Communication and teamwork

8. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:

- a) Telling your NMC case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
- b) Giving your NMC case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.

9. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:

- a) Any organisation or person you work for.
- b) Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).
- c) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.

10. You must tell your NMC case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:

- a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
- b) Any investigation started against you'
- c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.

11. You must allow your NMC case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and/or progress under these conditions:

- a) Any current or future employer.
- b) Any educational establishment.
- c) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions.

Unless Miss Thompson's case has already been concluded or there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim conditions of practice order at a review meeting within the next six months and every six months thereafter. A panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the interim conditions of practice order at this meeting and Miss Thompson will be notified of the panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, or there has been a request for an early review, a panel will review the interim order at a hearing which Miss Thompson will be invited to attend in person, send a representative on Miss Thompson's behalf or submit written representations for the panel to consider. At any such review hearing the panel may revoke the interim order, it may confirm or vary the interim conditions of practice order, or it may replace it with an interim suspension order.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Miss Thompson. The NMC will write to Miss Thompson when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Miss Thompson in writing.
