Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim suspension order.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within six months of the expiry of any further period of suspension authorised by the High Court. The NMC will invite the reviewing panel to confirm the interim suspension order at that meeting, and Mr Cremin will be notified of the panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Mr Cremin is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Mr Cremin will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on Mr Cremin's behalf or submit written representations about whether the interim order continues to be necessary. Mr Cremin must inform his case officer if he would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Mr Cremin does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the interim order should be revoked or replaced, a reviewing panel will review the interim suspension order at a hearing which Mr Cremin and his representative will be invited to attend.

Mr Cremin should notify the NMC immediately of any material change of circumstances that may affect the interim order.

At any time, Mr Cremin or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed by a panel if any relevant new information becomes available.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Mr Cremin. The NMC will write to Mr Cremin when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Mr Cremin in writing.

That concludes this determination.
