Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to vary the current interim conditions of practice order.

The panel was of the view that the public would remain suitably protected by the vary of the following conditions:

For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role.

1. You must:

- a) Limit your employment, work and nursing practice nursing practice to one substantive employer namely [PRIVATE].
- b) You must only prescribe medication, or issue prescriptions, in the course of your employment, work and nursing practice with [PRIVATE] and in accordance with [PRIVATE]'s policies, procedures and prescribing arrangements.

2. You must meet with your line manager, mentor or supervisor three monthly to discuss the carrying out of your nursing duties including but not limited to:

- a) Your interactions with colleagues.
- b) Your interactions with patients.

You must send a report of these monthly meetings with your line manager, mentor or supervisor to your NMC case officer as and when they are completed within 7 days.

3. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:

- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting or leaving any employment.
- b) Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.

4. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:

- a) Any organisation or person you work for.

- b) Any agency you apply to or are registered with for work.
- c) Any employers you apply to for work (at the time of application).

5. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:

- a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
- b) Any investigation started against you.
- c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.

6. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:

- a) Any current or future employer.

The panel decided to confirm this interim conditions of practice order and it will run for the remainder of the current interim order.

Unless your case has already been concluded, this interim order must be reviewed before the end of the next six months and every six months thereafter. Additionally, you or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed if any new evidence becomes available that may be relevant to the interim order.

At any review, the reviewing panel may revoke the interim order or any condition of it, it may confirm the interim conditions of practice order, or vary any condition of it, or it may replace the interim conditions of practice order with an interim suspension order.

In certain circumstances, it may be possible for the interim conditions of practice order to be reviewed by a reviewing panel at an administrative meeting. Your case officer will write to you about this in due course.

A panel of the Fitness to Practise Committee has still to deal with the allegations made against you. The NMC will keep you informed of developments in relation to that issue.

This will be confirmed to you in writing.
