Agreed Removal Decision

Registrant: Lisa Clare Herbert

Part(s) of the register: Registered Nurse - Adult Nursing

Relevant Location: County Durham

On 12 September 2024 we received a referral raising a concern about Lisa Clare Herbert's fitness to practise. It's alleged that she

- incorrectly administered oral methadone to the wrong patient
- failed to follow controlled drugs procedures by recording methylphenidate in the patient's own controlled drug register without seeking a second checker
- did not escalate the error to a doctor or complete an incident report
- did not document the error in the nursing notes
- did not record the patient's vital signs adequately or at all
- did not inform and/or apologise to the patient.

The referral is at the early stages of the investigation and is yet to be considered by the case examiners. No allegation against Lisa Clare Herbert has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

Lisa Clare Herbert does not accept the concerns raised about her and maintains that she had no recollection of the incident or of being informed about the error.

On 15 March 2026 we received an application from Lisa Clare Herbert for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Lisa Clare Herbert's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- agreed removal application form
- information obtained as part of investigation to date
- the interests of Lisa Clare Herbert
- the public interest.

We sought to contact the person who made the allegation against Lisa Clare Herbert for their comments on the application for agreed removal. No comments were received within a reasonable period.

I'm satisfied that:

- Lisa Clare Herbert no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- Although serious, the allegations against Lisa Clare Herbert aren't likely to result in a striking-off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Lisa Clare Herbert to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, **7 September 2026**. In the event that Lisa Clare Herbert seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
