Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to confirm the current interim conditions of practice order.

The panel has determined that the following conditions are proportionate and appropriate:

‘For the purposes of these conditions, ‘employment’ and ‘work’ mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, ‘course of study’ and ‘course’ mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must only work for Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust at Manchester Royal Infirmary.
2. You must not work in any role that involves direct contact with patients or patients’ relatives in person, on the telephone, or remotely.
3. You must not work in a role that has any budgetary or financial responsibility.
4. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by giving your case officer your employer’s contact details.
5. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to your employer.
6. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
 - a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
 - b) Any investigation started against you.
 - c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.

7. You must allow your case officer to share with your employer, as necessary, details about, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions.

Unless Mrs Jewsbury case has already been concluded or there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at a review meeting within the next six months and every six months thereafter. A panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the interim suspension order at this meeting and Mrs Jewsbury will be notified of the panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, or there has been a request for an early review, a panel will review the interim order at a hearing which Mrs Jewsbury will be invited to attend in person, send a representative on Mrs Jewsbury's behalf or submit written representations for the panel to consider. At any such review hearing the panel may revoke the interim order, it may confirm the interim suspension order or it may replace it with an interim conditions of practice order.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against Mrs Jewsbury. The NMC will write to Mrs Jewsbury when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to Mrs Jewsbury in writing.

That concludes this determination.
