10:20:23 AM BST	Do we know why the numbers of CMHN's has declined since 2017? <i>Response: The numbers we presented reflect a decline of those nurses who have an NMC approved SPQ in community mental health nursing, not all community mental health nurses or nurses who work in the community. There are several factors that influence the SPQ community mental health nursing numbers, availability of course funding, employer choice, and student demand. Lower demand/uptake of courses leads to fewer courses available locally that professionals can access.</i>

There are many course options available to you which is great for your future nursing career. A specialist practice qualification (SPQ) can also be achieved as part of a master's qualification – this is already possible. On successful completion individuals can record their SPQ to their individual registration details on the NMC register. We know from our evaluation that the SPQ helps students strengthen their practice making them confident enough to lead teams and services.</i></p>
10:22:01 AM BST	<p>Is it possible to know what percentage of the CMHT workforce is now a CMHN with the a SPQ?</p> <p><i>Response: We do not have that figure because we don't have data on exactly how many nurses are working in community mental health services. What we do know is that as of September 2020 we had 91,215 mental health nurses on the register and there are 1,202 SPQ community mental health nurses on our register (about 1.3%).</i></p>
