Section two

Summary of review and findings

Middlesex University (MU) is an approved education institution (AEI) who currently deliver three-year full-time bachelor of science with honours (BSc (Hons) direct entry routes leading to nursing registration in one of three fields (adult, child or mental health). The original programme was approved by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) on 16 September 2019.

A major modification to the programme to deliver a four-year part-time BSc (Hons) nurse degree apprenticeship (NDA) direct entry route in adult nursing and in mental health nursing and a four-year part-time BSc (Hons) NDA employed route in adult nursing and in mental health nursing was approved by the NMC on 23 April 2020. From 11 December 2020 the NMC endorsed the four-year part-time employed route as a BSc (Hons) nursing (adult) seconded pathway for delivery on the States of Guernsey.

MU faculty of health, social care and education, department of adult, child and midwifery is seeking approval for a modification to their BSc (Hons) NDA employed route in adult nursing, to amend the total period of enrolment from four years part-time to three years and six months. The proposal involves a reduction in the number of 'non-assessed' weeks, but no changes to the approved academic study programme or the assessed practice placement elements of the programme. The programme is delivered from MUs north London campus.

MU confirm that this shorter route will replace both the four-year part-time BSc (Hons) NDA employed route in adult nursing and the four-year part-time BSc (Hons) NDA direct entry route in adult nursing.

There are effective working relationships between MU and the employer partners (EPs) / practice learning partners (PLPs) involved in the NDA programme. Documentation reviewed in advance of the visit and discussions during the modification visit demonstrates a collaborative approach involving stakeholders in all aspects of the programme. The key EPs confirm that the modification is instigated by them and is a result of their request to MU to bring the programme in line with others offered in the London area.

EPs approved to deliver the NDA with MU are University College London Hospitals NHA Foundation Trust and Royal Free London NHS Foundation Trust.

Documentary evidence demonstrates that MU have several approaches to ensure that equality, diversity and inclusion (EDI) is embedded into the university community and the student journey, as part of the student journeys transformation programme, a university wide initiative. Within the faculty staff undergo training in

equality and diversity to raise awareness, and key principles will be reflected in a soon to be published EDI toolkit. Attainment data is monitored centrally and reviewed and reported on during the annual monitoring process at programme level. The documentary evidence confirms that EDI data is collected and reported at programme level and that the programme team are working towards a more consistent reporting framework in line with their current EDI action plan.

This modification visit is undertaken by remote means.

The Standards framework for nursing and midwifery education (SFNME) (NMC, 2018) isn't met at programme level as conditions apply.

Findings against the standard and requirements

Documentary evidence indicates that key stakeholders (EPs and PLPs) were consulted in advance of the proposed modification. During the modification visit current EPs / PLPs confirm that the proposed programme modification is requested by them. They're keen to continue to work with MU and the introduction of this shorter route will bring the MU programme in line with others available in London. EPs / PLPs describe the collaborative development of the proposal and confirm their involvement in the process.

Documentary analysis and subsequent discussion at the modification visit provides evidence of partnership working with PLPs and apprentice EPs in relation to programme delivery and evaluation, with shared responsibility for theory and practice learning. There are open channels of communication between MU and EPs / PLPs, who recognise the importance of clear communication and close working relationships with MU in the management of apprentices.

During the visit we meet with apprentices from the current NDA programme who comment favourably on their experience. They commend MU and their employers for identifying a good range of placement settings in order to maximise opportunities to gain diverse clinical experience. They appreciate the support offered to them in both academic and clinical settings. The tripartite review process is seen as an effective way of supporting their practice development and they're very positive about the relationship with MU. Apprentices reflect on the benefits of face-to-face learning and the provision of iPads to enhance their use of the e-portfolio practice assessment tool.

Although it doesn't impact directly on the current cohort of apprentices, they're supportive of the change. Apprentices point out that the non-assessed weeks within their programme can sometimes lead them to lose focus on academic and practice learning until their next placement begins. They feel that this modification allows future apprentices to retain their focus on learning throughout the programme.
