SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

The University of Bradford provides a high standard of pre-registration mental health nursing education and there are processes in place to manage key risks identified by the NMC. The V300 Prescribing for Healthcare Professionals Programme was approved in 2006 and the V150 Community Nurse Prescribing Programme added by Minor Modification in 2008. The programme has been reviewed and updated for re-approval which is scheduled for mid-February.

Resources are good and a move to the University City Campus in summer of 2011 has provided a refurbished Horton Building and a new purpose built extension. There is a new state of the art clinical skills laboratory, a movement laboratory and a digital imaging suite available. Current staffing is sufficient for both programmes with students commenting very positively on the expertise of lecturers and their support during their studies. Pre-registration mental health students are supported in practice by suitable mentors. A Designated Medical Practitioners (DMP) are available for the V300 programme and Community Nurse Prescribing Mentors (CNP Mentor) for the V150 programme, all of whom have appropriate qualifications are available in sufficient numbers to support current prescribing students.

Selection of students is undertaken jointly with the employers. For the prescribing programmes the selection process also includes a Non-medical Prescribing Lead and SHA representative. The selection process now includes numeracy testing and verification that the student is working at the appropriate level. In response to identified concerns about self-funded and non-NHS students a new and more detailed application form has been developed. However ensuring the forms are signed off by all parties would further strengthen the risk control mechanism. Safeguards are in place to prevent unsuitable students from progressing to qualification.

Effective partnership working between education and service providers is demonstrated and practitioners are involved in curriculum development and delivery. University and Trust response to Care Quality Commission visits is commended as an example of effective practice with the development of a colour coded alert for monitoring of action plans. The School is also commended on service user involvement in the programmes which is highly valued by the students. Placement audits are generic in nature and all are current on the database for pre-registration mental health. The course team are looking to develop a more sensitive and specific educational audit/placement profile to approve learning opportunities and resources for the prescribing programmes. In a similar vein, the development and maintenance of a wider database of DMPs and CNP mentors could prove an advantage due to the projected increase in student numbers.

Students evaluate both programmes very positively and systems for following up issues highlighted in the evaluation of the prescribing programme are being strengthened for the upcoming programme re-approval.
